Call to Order Attendance (Members and Guests)

Review and Approval of Minutes (August Meeting) August meeting minutes approved by a yes vote by all present.

#### 1. Principals Report:

Principal Muecke shared the benchmark data with the site council. Magee total for 24-25 89.31%. Minimal proficient students have dropped which increased the partially proficient data.

Math had a decrease in minimally proficient. New curriculum Eureka Math. Students need some basic fundamentals from 5<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Students will be doing IXL and working on fundamental skills in advisory to increase student success.

2 identified subgroups – African American students and Ex Ed students — rose in proficiency and had a slight achievement.

- \*African American student services come to our site to help students-Parent representative feels that they do not do enough to help in academics.
- \*it would be more beneficial if SS helped in that area.
- \*How are students being selected and how is the time being used by Student services?
- \* They need to help students move on to UHS
- \*It needs to be equitable
- \*Students being taken out of core class learning is not helping the student
- \*Having a meeting with student services to know what is the mission and goal and purpose would be advisable
- 6<sup>th</sup> grade ELA rose 6% in proficiency –Magee stands at 28.1% 6<sup>th</sup> grade Math had 28% proficiency as well (minimally proficient went down which benefits numbers)
- 7<sup>th</sup> ELA Increase in proficiency 27.8%
- 7<sup>th</sup> Math Increase 11.3% (minimally proficient went down which benefits numbers)
- 8<sup>th</sup> grade ELA we had a decrease 21.1%— possibly due to time on task by student—stamina from students is not there. Possibly offering snacks during test and going out for a walk about before test may help test scores increase.
- 8<sup>th</sup> Math increased 8.2%
- 2. EVENTS: Fall Festival was student run and was successful, students and families had a great time enjoying food, games and a great story time in the library.
  - Bloom outreach for 5<sup>th</sup> graders to come to Magee next year. Nov. 8<sup>th</sup> for a tour.
  - United Way Day of Caring Nov 2<sup>nd</sup>. U of A students, our Avid and Student Council students will be doing a revitalize our campus day from 8 to 12
- 3. Vote for \$200 that was submitted to be used for Ms. Marshalls classroom. A motion was made (Mr. Muecke to approve these funds for Ms. Marshalls classroom, with a second motion by Ms. Ali-Osman. A vote was carried and approved.

- 4. Budget item (Mrs. Butler shared about having the funds from Catalina Island accounts moved to Undesignated and the business office budget accounts.
- 5. Tshirts for Esports \$500.00. This item was tabled as more information is needed. Vendor to purchase from as well as how much the jerseys will cost.
