



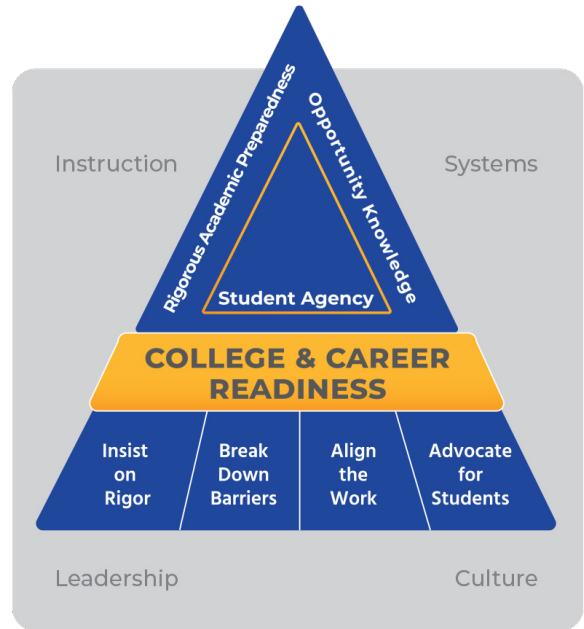
AVID's mission is to close the opportunity gap by preparing all students for college readiness and success in a global society.

Arizona's Students Served: 2018-19

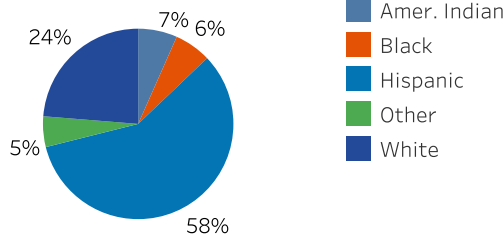

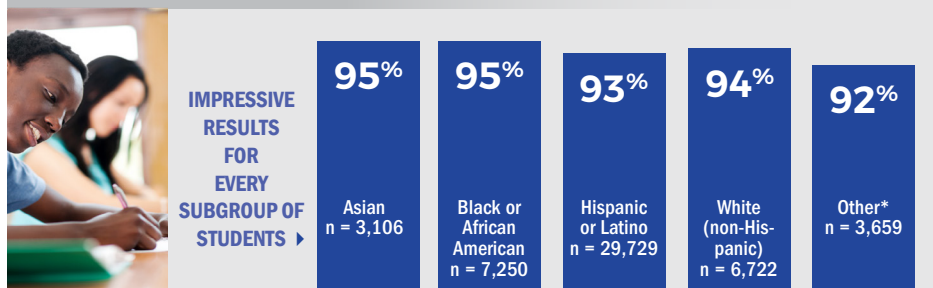
Race/Ethnic Identity of Arizona AVID Students
